
Throughout your thirty-one hard-working, dedication-filled years in the Hempstead School District, you have, indeed, held many notable positions and acquired honorable titles.

The band also entertained us with it's fantastic performances in the St. Patricks Day and Columbus Day Parades. The marching band students participated in the concert band throughout the entire school year.








Sectionals, Sectionals, Sectionals! What are they? Just ask any band or orchestra student and you will get the answer.


To these students, one of the most gratifying periods of the school day is orchestra during zero period. During that period the students learn the fundamentals of music both as a science and as an art.



THE DRAMA CLUB


The Drama Club, alias the 4th Wall Players, once again brought success to the stage of Hempstead High School.

Under the direction of Mr. R. Russo, the club members learned and perfected and assortment of dramatic techniques which they so vividly exhibited in their performances.






CADETTES

Finally, you have the finished product which you now hold in your hands. A miracle at HHS has occurred. We created a book !



Success resulted from their impressive display of team work and the maximum effort each girl put into the squad.


VOLLEY BALL






