




MR. STANLEY SILVERMAN














OCTOBER 29,1983:






The Tigers went on to stomp the Indians in one of the more exciting games this year. Final score of the game:

















































































































> PIECES OF A DREAM =


HARVARD MODEL UNITED NATIONS CONFERENCE





Black pride among Blacks of today is almost diminished. Many young Blacks do not understand that being Black is a state of existence and not a color, shape, or form. The Black pride of the 1960's produced many changes for the Black man such as intergation and voting

Blacks growing up today seem to feel that Black pride is all in the past, whereas Blacks of yesterday feel it was an important milestone of the Black race.

Being Black is definately a

one would think, not only the present, but the future as well. Right now, there are three different kinds of history in America; White history, Negro history and Black history

White History is an institutionalized compilation of facts that is the most prestigious of all American history. It is taught in all public schools and universities in the United States. Summarily stated, white history epitomizes America as beginning great and ever increasing in greatness. White history exemplifies how American democracy is and makes its leaders feel that they have a special mission in the world. After all, with a vast and virgin country that was supposedly so sparsely populated by Indians who could so easily be killed or pushed aside, what was to stop this great experiment?

Negro History comprises old acceptable norms of Black history Negro History comprises old acceptable norms of Black history depicting yesterdays' passive thinking. It is the history most heard of in Black communities. Negro history quietly conveys most of what white history states and portrays similar pictures of a great nation. The plight from indignation to dignity illustrates some flaws and pains but never characterizes the Black as "somebody." Negro history tries to show her worthiness of a place in America and that Black people can be included in the great American society without diminishing the picture any diminishing the picture any

Black History, on the other hand, tries to shatter white ideals and create an equal position. It judges America by the way Indians and blacks have been treated and states that there is no American history because white people have written without dealing with the Red and Black experiences. Black history says that no society can get rid of an original people and bring over another group of people as slaves, and call itself a democracy. Black history speaks out against passivity and portrays an established realm of existence.

Tyrone Payne 3rd in Hempstead Tournament, 3rd at East Meadow, Syosset champion, 4th in divisional tournament.







"STEP INTO MY WORLD"






