On behalf of the Colonial staff and student body, we would like to thank Mrs. Pilkington for twenty years of service and to wish her the best for the future.



Many of us have seen on television the shocking ravages of starvation suffered by the people in Ethiopia. Millions of people are likely to die due to the lack of something to eat. The long range cause of such a catastrophe is the prolonged drought which is taking place in much of the African continent. Such theories are poor excuses for allowing a nation of people to suffer such a horrible death.

Without doing any research many of us know that we have greatly expanded our supply of the world's food. We can grow all kinds of fruits and vegetables larger and use less acreage. We have improved fish hatcheries, poultry and animal farming. December 2nd's New York Times stated that the world's grain supply has increased twenty percent since the 1970's. Many nations such as China have started to store grain surpluses. The U.S.S.R. is the only country that has not caught up with its demand for grain. Then, why is Ethiopia starving? Would any other country be allowed to starve like this?

In addition to the debilitating effects of starvation, there is disease, physical and mental crippling of the body and mind. The inconceivable agony of watching the members of one's family die can scarcely reach the imagination.

During the month of November there was a drive at Hempstead High School to collect funds to help toward the relief of starvation in Ethiopia. The National Honor Society under Mrs. Gwen Carroll's direction went to the various homerooms to help with the collections. The sum of five hundred and fifty dollars (\$550) was collected and a check was sent through the Catholic Relief Services, Ethiopia Fund. This organization advertised that it would send 100% of all funds collected to the cause. We should all be proud that we played a part in this humanitarian gesture.

The drought continues, the casualties mount — should we have another opportunity, let us all respond to the cry of Ethiopia.

Hence, he must comprehend the entire operation of the insurance and pension fields because his evaluations often influence company policies and practices.

- 3) At the eleventh and twelfth grade level, any student who is taking or has taken a course offered by the business education department is eligible to join the State Association.








Fellow Graduates;

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
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
