
The year 1980 kicks off a decade of challenge and opportunity which will no doubt surpass our most imaginative expectations.


My years at Hempstead High have been very happy ones. I have gained much knowledge and maturity. My friendships with both students and teachers have enhanced my experiences.


Throughout your thirty-one hard-working, dedication-filled years in the Hempstead School District, you have, indeed, held many notable positions and acquired honorable titles.



The Juniors were also busy ordering their class rings, taking the PSAT'S and numerous other Regents exams.






HEMPSTEAD HIGH BAND






To these students, one of the most gratifying periods of the school day is orchestra during zero period. During that period the students learn the fundamentals of music both as a science and as an art.



In saluting their work this year, we can say that they performed admirably and competently, as always.




VARSITY BASKETBALL







The team completed their second undefeated season in a row. The team won their League TITLE and was voted the best High school basketball team in Nassau County.




